Q How is the Adoption Information Disclosure service different between adoption agencies and NCRC?

NCRC and adoption agencies have the same process to provide the service. However, as adoption agencies handled the adoption process for adoptees firsthand, they have the original adoption documents.

Therefore, the adoptees who request the information disclosure for the first time or wish to see the original adoption documents should use the service provided by adoption agencies.

NCRC, an agency affiliated by the Ministry of Health and Welfare, have adoption information collected from now defunct adoption agencies, and can provide the Adoption Information Disclosure service if adoptees wish to petition as well as functional adoption agency's documents

Q How long does it take to receive the final result of Adoption Information Disclosure Service?

The applicable law states that adoptees shall receive the result within 45 days from the application. However, it may take longer than 45 days as locating birth parents and obtaining their consent to release information can take extra time

Q Can adoptees find their relatives or other family members if the birth parents are deceased or cannot be found?

The Act on Special Cases Concerning Adoption currently allows information disclosure only for birth parents. Therefore only the personal information of birth parents can be searched. There are no legal grounds to search personal information of other relatives or related persons, and etc.

Q Can adoptees find other information about birth parents, such as phone number, etc., in addition to address?

Due to Korea's strengthened personal information protection regulations, it is not possible to check information other than the address of a birth parent registered in the resident registration system.

Q Can adoptees have access to birth parents' personal information on adoption records if birth parents are deceased or cannot be found?

Even if birth parents are deceased or their whereabouts cannot be verified, the information cannot be disclosed as birth parents' consent is not gained.


[If birth parents are deceased, can adoptees have access to the information such as cause of death and place of burial?

NCRC can only verify whereabouts of birth parents. Such information including cause of death and place of burial is unavailable to disclose.

Adoption Information Disclosure service

What is Adoption Information Disclosure service?

Adoption Information Disclosure is a service which allows adoptees to request and obtain their adoption information from organizations concerned such as National Center for the Rights of the Child (NCRC) or adoption agencies

* Related law: Act on Special Cases Concerning Adoption.

Request eligibility

- A person who has been adopted under the Act on Special Cases Concerning Adoption
- If an adoptee is a minor under the age of 19, he / she must obtain consent from his / her adoptive parents



- First-time applicants should submit the documents to adoption agencies first. From the second time onwards, applicants can choose to submit in between NCRC or adoption agencies.
- Consult with the NCRC if adoptee does not have information on the adoption agency that facilitated their adoption or if their adoption agency is no longer in business.

Adoption Information Disclosure process

- ① When requested to disclose adoption information, NCRC or an adoption agency provides the adoption background information to the adoptee by sending an email or having a face—to–face meeting, etc.
- ② If identifying information of birth parent is available on adoption records, the information will be provided to the adoptee after obtaining consent from the birth parents.
- 2 -1. If the birth parent's identification can not be verified, then the adoptee can register their DNA data at a Korean police station or their Korean Embassy(Consulate) overseas. They may also utilize Korean press or media to continue searching for their birth family. * See p.5~6 for more information about registering DNA data, press and media support.
- 3 NCRC locates the birth parent of the adoptee to obtain consent for information disclosure.
 - * When adoption agencies conduct a search, they request for NCRC's assistance to verify birth parent's current address.
 - 1) Search on Public Information Sharing System: When name and resident ID number of birth parent is written on adoption records, birth parent's current address is verified through the Public Information Sharing System.
 - 2) Request for cooperation of local governments: When name, age and address(at the time of relinquishment) of the birth parent is written on adoption records, birth parent's current address is identified with the assist of local governments such as district (gu) offices.

 3) Request for cooperation of other public agencies: If the identified address is inaccurate, NCRC inquires their whereabouts to other public agencies.
- (4) When current address of birth parent is identified, NCRC or an adoption agency sends a registered mail(up to 3 times) to obtain consent for information release from the birth parent.
- (5) When birth parent agrees to disclose his / her information to the adoptee, NCRC or an adoption agency supports DNA testing to confirm the biological relationship and disclose birth parent's information to the adoptee.
- When birth parent refuses to give consent or do not respond to the mail, birth parent's information cannot be disclosed.
- (6) When birth parent and adoptee both wishes to meet, NCRC or an adoption agency facilitates letter exchanges and a family reunion while providing interpretation and counseling services.

Registering DNA data

According the Atricle 11 the Act on the Protection and Support of Missing Children, etc., adoptees who do not have birth family information at the time of adoption, can register their DNA data at a police station in Korea or through Korean Embassy(Consulate) overseas.

Eliaibility

Korean adoptees who have petitioned for Adoption Information Disclosure but can't verify their birth parents' identity as there is no or inadequate identifying information of birth parents

How to apply

After petitioning Adoption Information Disclosure, adoptees will be checked for eligibility from NCRC and then can visit a police station in Korea or Korean Embassy(Consulate) overseas for DNA testing

Process

- DNA sample taken by Korean Embassy(Consulate) or police station will be compared with the DNA database of missing children's families' by NCRC and National Forensic Service.
- When there is a DNA match, Korean Embassy(Consulate) or police will notify the test result to the adoptee. Then, NCRC will facilitate a family reunion.

Additional assistance for searching family

When birth parents cannot be found due to lack of information, adoptees can utilize services as below.

NCRC created the database of adoption records by collecting information from now defunct adoption agencies or children's facilities so that such information can be provided to adoptees requesting for the disclosure of adoption information.
